

Spiritual Gifts Test

The following Spiritual Gifts Test is based primarily on the Wagner “Modified Houts Questionnaire”. This spiritual gifts discovery instrument was originally suggested by Dr. Richard F. Houts, a professor at the North American Baptist Theological Seminary, in 1976. Subsequently, it was modified by C. Peter Wagner of the Charles E. Fuller Institute of Evangelism and Church Growth and keyed into his classic book, *Your Spiritual Gifts Can Help Your Church Grow*. It has been further supplemented with some updated language and definitions from Jon Thompson’s *Book Convergence* by the team at Ellerslie Road Baptist Church.

The three or four gifts you score highest in may or may not be your spiritual gifts. But you can be sure in any case that they are a starting point for prayer and experimentation. You will need other members of the body of Christ to help you confirm what gifts you have.

How to use this tool

Step 1: Go through the list of (110) statements in the questionnaire on the following pages. For each one, mark to what extent the statement is true of your life: MUCH, SOME, LITTLE, or NOT AT ALL.

STEP 2: When you are finished, score the questionnaire by means of the Spiritual Gifts Chart on page (12)

STEP 3: Review this section defining spiritual gifts and reflect on your highest scoring gifts. Spend time reading the passages where your highest scoring gifts are seen in the bible.

STEP 4: Complete the Reflection questions to gain a tentative evaluation of where your gifts may lie and explore the implications for your ministry in the body of Christ.

Step 3: Review Gift Definitions

The following three pages contain suggested definitions of the spiritual gifts. While not meant to be dogmatic or final, these definitions and supporting Scriptures do correspond to characteristics of the gifts as expressed in the Wagner-Modified Houts Questionnaire.

Prophecy: The gift of prophecy is the special ability that God gives to certain members of the body of Christ to receive and communicate an immediate message of God to His people through a divinely-anointed utterance.	I Cor. 12:10, 28 Eph. 4:11 – 14 Romans 12:6 Luke 7:26 Acts 15:32 Acts 21:9 – 11

Teaching: The gift of teaching is the special ability that God gives to certain members of the body of Christ to communicate information relevant to the health and ministry of the body and its members in such a way that others will learn. Wisdom: The gift of wisdom is the special ability that God gives to certain members of the body of Christ to know the mind of the Holy Spirit in such a way as to receive insight into how given knowledge may best be applied to specific needs arising in the body of Christ. Some groups refer to a “Word of Wisdom”, this idea is about a prophetic insight that can only come through God. This may relate more to gifts of Prophecy, or leadership. Knowledge: The gift of knowledge is the special ability that God gives to certain members of the body of Christ to discover, accumulate, analyze, and clarify information and ideas which are pertinent to the well being of the body. Exhortation: The gift of exhortation is the special ability that God gives to certain members of the body of Christ to minister words of comfort, consolation, encouragement, and counsel to other members of the body in such a way that they feel helped and healed. Discernment: The gift of discerning of spirits is the special ability that God gives to certain members of the body of Christ to know with assurance whether certain behaviour purported to be of God is in reality divine, human, or satanic.
